Notice is hereby given that I will on November 18, 2021 at 10:00 AM in the main lobby of the Clatsop County Sheriff's Office, 1190 SW 19th Street, Warrenton, Oregon, sell, at public oral auction to the highest bidder, for cash or cashier's check, the following real property, subject to redemption, commonly known as 92816 Cherry Road, Astoria, Oregon 97103, and further described as,

Parcel 1 of PARTITION PLAT NO. 1996-013, situated in the Southwest quarter of Section 17, Township 8 North, Range 7 West, Willamette Meridian, County of Clatsop, State of Oregon, as recorded May 10, 1996 in Partition Plat Book 2, page 135, Clatsop County Records.

Said sale is made under a writ of execution issued out of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Clatsop.

The Notice of Sale will be published in The Columbia Press, a newspaper of general circulation in Clatsop County, Oregon, for publication for four weeks, to wit: October 1, 2021; October 8, 2021; October 15, 2021; October 22, 2021.

The Notice of Sale will be posted on the Oregon State Sheriff's Association (OSSA) website, <http://oregonsheriffssales.org/>, for at least 28 days prior to the date of the sale. The first full day of posting is October 1, 2021.

NOTICE TO DEBTOR

You may have a right to surplus funds remaining after payment of costs and satisfaction of the judgment, as provided in ORS 18.950 (4).

If you transfer or sell your right to redemption, you might not have the right to surplus funds.


BEFORE BIDDING AT THE SALE, A PROSPECTIVE BIDDER SHOULD INDEPENDENTLY INVESTIGATE:

- (a) **The priority of the lien or interest of the judgment creditor;**
- (b) **Land use laws and regulations applicable to the property;**
- (c) **Approved uses for the property;**
- (d) **Limits on farming or forest practices on the property;**
- (e) **Rights of neighboring property owners; and**
- (f) **Environmental laws and regulations that affect the property.**

Conditions of Sale: Potential bidders must arrive no later than 15 minutes prior to the auction to register and allow the Clatsop County Sheriff's Office to review bidder's funds. Individuals without proof of sufficient funds, or that have not qualified before the start of the auction will not be allowed to participate. Only U.S. currency and/or cashier's checks made payable to Clatsop County Sheriff's Office will be accepted. Payment must be made in full immediately upon the close of the sale. Only the judgment creditor who obtained the Writ may credit bid up the Writ amount plus allowable costs. The judgment creditor must have cash in hand for any difference above the amount of the Writ and allowable costs.
